

VISA FOR FAMILY MEMBERS OF EU/EEA-NATIONALS OR SWISS NATIONALS EXERCISING HIS/HER RIGHT TO FREE MOVEMENT IN ANOTHER EU/EEA MEMBER STATE OR SWITZERLAND

Family visits where e.g. the applicant is a family member to an EU/EEA-national or Swiss national exercising or planning to exercise his/her right to free movement in Denmark he/she has a right to have his/her visa application processed as soon as possible if the below-mentioned documentation is provided.

Applications for visas (short term visit visa) can be submitted at Gerry's Visa Service Center in Islamabad, Lahore or Karachi, but a service fee must then be paid. Please find contact information etc. here [Gerry's Visa Service Center](#).

An application should in principle be lodged at least 15 calendar days before the intended visit and cannot be lodged earlier than three months before the start of the intended visit. It is an applicant's own responsibility to take the necessary precautions in relation to the processing time, deadlines, etc.

Applications must be submitted personally along with the following documents. Please check that the forms are correctly filled in, signed and dated:

- Family Information Form

- Original passport and possibly national identity card, (the validity of the passport must be at least 3 months beyond the date you are leaving the Schengen area), and previous passports, if held.
- A copy of the first two pages of your passport and valid visas, and a copy of your national identity card.
- Two passport size photographs. The photographs must be size 3.50 cm x 4.50 cm, facing and looking directly into the camera. Head must measure 3.00-3.60 cm from chin to top of the head, and the upper part of shoulder should be visible. Colour with a light neutral background, no more than six months old and a good likeness of you, bareheaded unless you have special religious reasons; no sunglasses.
- When applicants are **spouses, cohabiting partners aged 18 or more, and direct descendants under the age of 21**, documentation for the family relation, e.g. marriage certificate, birth certificate etc. must be provided.
- When applicants are descendants (**e.g. children, grandchildren**) **more than 21 years of age** of the EU/EEA national/the Swiss or of his/her spouse/partner, or **ascendants (e.g. parents, grandparents)** of the EU/EEA national/Swiss national or his/her spouse/partner, documentation must be provided that the EU/EEA national/Swiss national or his/her spouse/partner supports the family member, e.g. proof of regular payments or money transfers to the applicant's bank account, regular tenancy payments etc.

- With regard to **parents** who provide for their child, who is an EU/EEA national or Swiss national, documentation of this must be submitted, e.g. proof of regular payments or money, transfers to the child's bank account, regular tenancy payments etc.
- With regards to **other family members (e.g. siblings, cousins etc.)** documentation that, in the country they relocate from, they are dependants of the EU/EEA national/the Swiss national or are living under his/her roof in the country they come from, e.g. proof of regular payments or money transfers to the applicant's bank account, regular tenancy payments etc.
- With regard to **other family members (e.g. parents, grandparents, siblings, cousins etc, who do not fulfil the above mentioned requirements)** documentation that serious health issues make it absolutely imperative that the EU/EEA national/the Swiss national personally takes care of the person in question, e.g. a medical certificate stating that the applicant suffers from serious illness along with information from the applicant that he/she has no other relatives in the home country who can take care of him/her.
- Documentation that the EU/EEA national or Swiss national **is exercising his/her right to free movement in Denmark**, e.g. a copy of the registration certificate issue by a Danish Regional Administrative body to the EU/EEA national, host to a specific address the EU/EEA national resides etc.

No fee – Exempted from paying a fee are:

- Spouses, cohabiting partners etc. of nationals from other EU/EEA Member State than Denmark and their children or the spouse's/partner's children that have not reached the age of 21 or who are maintained by the EU/EEA national as well as relatives in lineal ascent and the spouse's/partner's relatives in lineal ascent who are maintained by the EU/EEA national. The EU/EEA rules shall also apply to Switzerland.
- Please note that a service fee will be charged by Gerry's Visa Service Center if you apply there.

A decision may be expected within 15 days after the application has been considered admissible. In individual cases this period may be extended up to a maximum of 30 or 60 days.

Please note that possession of a Schengen visa does NOT guarantee entry into a Schengen state, and no rights can be derived from the information obtained in the general Schengen visa information.
